

Welcome to Trinity Episcopal Preschool Summer Camp 2019!

We are so excited to welcome your children and family to summer camp 2019! We have many fun themes and activities planned this summer. Please read on for information on all details of camp!

Camp Themes and Activities

Every week is different and each day your child will be participating in a lesson based around the theme. Campers may work on art projects, science experiments, music and movement activities, cooking lessons, and more to get in-depth with the weekly theme.

Mad Scientist Camp: Mad Scientist camp allows children to become “junior scientists”! Campers will see, smell, taste, touch and hear what science is all about. Plan for an exciting week of hands-on science experiments! (June 17-21)

BSO Camp: BSO Camp is all about the music and campers will be focusing on experiencing real instruments while also making their own musical instruments! (June 24-28)

Famous Artists Camp: Campers will learn about the “Ninja Turtle” artists (Michelangelo, Donatello, Raphael, Leonardo) and will create works of art inspired by these artists. (July 1-5)
*Camp is CLOSED on Thursday July 4

Around the World in 80 Days Camp: Campers will become world travelers by discovering music, art, food and more from countries around the globe. Each day will focus on a different country! (July 8-12)

World Music Camp: World Music Camp focuses on musical styles from different parts of the world. Campers will also learn traditional dances from different countries! (July 15-19)

Recycled Art Camp: Using everyday materials, campers will create beautiful art projects while learning about the importance of recycling materials. (July 22-26)

All About Maryland Camp: Crabs, orioles, Black-eyed Susans, terrapins...this week is all about Maryland! Children will learn all about Maryland state symbols through hands-on creative projects and team activities. (July 29-Aug 2)

STEAM Camp: All About Nature!: Campers will be outside more than ever with our Nature STEAM camp! With so many nature-inspired activities based around science, technology, engineering, art, and math, campers will have a busy week outdoors! (August 5-9)

Superheroes of the Bible Camp: Our last week of camp focuses on what makes someone a ‘hero’. Campers will learn about different heroes of the Bible while discovering their own ‘hero’ traits like kindness, courage and honesty through stories, music and superhero crafts! (August 12-16)

Camp Policies and Procedures

-When signing up for individual one-week sessions, they are **only** offered for 5 days per week. Alternatively, your child can attend full time for the whole summer OR they can attend part time (MWF or Tu/Th) ONLY if they will be attending all 9 weeks of camp.

-Camp opens at 7:30 am and ends at 5:30 pm. Families may pick up anytime before 5:30 pm, and we request that children are here by 9:00 am each morning so they can start their camp day.

-In the summer, we do not offer carpool. Please plan on parking in our lot and walking your child into the building. **All children must be signed in AND out daily as a licensing requirement.** The sign-in sheets are located on the clipboard in the front lobby.

-Please plan on sending a crib sized sheet, small pillow and blanket for nap time. All children nap from 1-3 pm each day. Pre-K campers will have a quiet time as required by state licensing, but it will be modified from the normal school-year nap time.

-Sunscreen: Please plan on applying sunscreen every morning before camp. We will apply sunscreen every afternoon before going outside. All children must have their own labeled sunscreen (no spray sunscreens please; they make the floor very slippery). All campers must also have a form on file for sunscreen; these will be available closer to the summer.

-Campers should bring 2-3 pairs of extra clothes. If two-year-old children are still in diapers, please provide diapers and wipes.

-Water Play: Every Friday is Water Play Day! All classes will have a turn in our sprinkler area. Please send your child in their swimsuit with their regular clothes on top, along with a pair of water shoes and a towel. Please send a pair of socks, underwear and regular shoes for your child to change into after water play.

-Each child should bring their own labeled water bottle every day. It will stay in their cubby and they can get drinks as needed. Please plan on sending your child with a lunch every day. We will provide morning and afternoon snacks, along with milk at each meal or snack.

-For new families: paperwork must be turned in BEFORE your child's first day of camp. Children's files must be complete before they can start, and any missing forms may result in a delayed start date.

Summer Camp Tuition

-For individual one-week camp sessions: Tuition is due in full by June 1, 2019.

-If signing up for the entire summer: ½ of full summer tuition is due June 1, 2019 and the second ½ is due July 1, 2019.

-You may sign your child up for additional camps if space permits. Camp tuition for additional weeks will be due before the first day of camp.

-Camp tuition is nonrefundable.
